1. The event

The Club de Voile de la Baie d'Erquy, in close cooperation with Brittany Region, Côtes d'Armor Department and hosting cities, plans to organize 30th anniversary edition of the Costarmoricaine Raid from 8 to 13 August 2023, and is proud to bid for F18 Raid Worlds Title, as in 2018.



a. Programme

8 August 2023: Equipment inspection

9 August 2023: 1st leg: Erquy – Bréhat Island

10 August 2023: 2nd leg: Bréhat Island – Perros Guirec

11 August 2023: 3rd leg: Perros Guirec – Saint Quay Portrieux

12 August 2023:: 4th leg Saint Quay Portrieux – Erquy

13 August 2023: 5th leg Erquy – Erquy via Cape Fréhel and Fort la Latte

b. Format

Costarmoricaine course makes a loop, divided in five legs, all around Côtes d'Armor Department, then offering true long-distance racing to sailors.

- Trailers will stay in Erquy, when two vans will transport luggage and camping gears from one stop to the other.
- Safety is paramount, particularly on long courses, when even minor speed differences can create large gaps among the competitors, hence a strong rescue team will accompany the fleet.
- It is imperative that competitors rebuild their strength: a hearty dinner is served every evening, and a hearty breakfast precedes the skippers' meeting every morning.

- A media team will provide pictures, video, as well daily press releases.
- Last, to maintain its charm and friendly atmosphere, while respecting the necessary safety requirements imposed by the navigation zones used by the race, the number of entries is limited to 25 teams. Selection of competitors will be made under IF18CA supervision.
- After 1st May 2023, entries will be received under first come, first served basis.

c. Entry fees

Standard entry fee is fixed at 650 Euros until 30th June 2023.

d. Hall of Fame

Since 1993, first edition year, many big names coming from various horizons of the sailing community did entered Costarmoricaine Raid, such as Billy Besson (2013 F18 World Champion, four times Nacra 17 World Champion), Boulogne brothers (2003 F18 World Champions), French pair Thibaut Vauchel Camus & Jérémie Lagarrigue (quintuple Costarmoricaine winners, double French Nationals Champions), Duncan Ross (Olympic RSA campaigner), Alain Comyn (Oceanic skipper, CataWorld Cup Winner), Thierry Dubois (Vendée Globe skipper), Yvan Bourgnon (Speed record breaker), Gérard Loos (multiple Dutch National Champion), Daniel Souben (Tornado European Vice-Champion, multiple winner of Tour de France à la Voile) Thijs Visser, (2009 F18 World Champion), Damien Iehl (triple winner of Tour de France à la Voile, International Match Racing competitor), Mischa Heemskerk & Stephan Dekker (2017 F18 World Champions), Hugo Dhallenne (Mini 6.50 Transat winner), without forgetting local heroes.

Well established Costarmoricaine renown should guarantee a quality slate of competitors, gathering la crème de la crème of the sport catamaran field.
